## FRANKENSTEIN


## STEP BY STEP GUIDE

## What you will need:

- White solid face paint (Global Colours brand)
- Baby Blue solid face paint (Global Colours brand)
- Dark Blue solid face paint (Global Colours brand)
- Strong Black solid face paint (Global Colours brand)
- Yellow solid face paint (Global Colours brand)
- Fine paint brush: Round #2 Global Colours brush
- Medium paint brush: Round #4 Global Colours brush
- Large paint brush: Flat 3/4 inch Global Colours brush
- Sponge





Gel the hair back off the face. Apply baby blue face paint to the whole face with a sponge, making sure to cover the eyebrows well.



Using a sponge, apply dark blue in the eye sockets, under the cheekbones and in the temples and blend the two blues where they meet. Draw a thin line of black face paint under the lower lashes. Rub with your finger to smudge.



Now draw thin blue dark lines as shown above to create the cut line out of both corners of the mouth. Rub these lines with a dry brush or the edge of a sponge to smudge/shade slightly. Colour the bottom lip black. Lightly sponge black face paint down each side of the nose and slightly wider at the tip, to give the illusion of a flared nostrils.



With a fine brush, paint in the cut lines on the eyebrows with dark blue face paint. With a thin brush and black face paint, add fine stitches to the cut lines on the mouth and eyebrows, then repeat in white face paint as a highlight. (Optionally you may also add some tiny stitches down the outside of the nose.)



Now paint in the cut lines on the forehead with dark blue face paint, add stitches in black and highlight in white as above. Lastly, with a large brush, run black face paint along and through the hairline, creating Frankenstein's fringe. Carry the black paint up into the hair if permitted.



To add a fun surprise element, ask the model to close their eyes (very important or it will smudge!). Draw a white almond-shaped "eye" right across the top eyelid and fill with white. Outline in black. Inside the circle, draw a smaller yellow dot, with a tiny black dot in the centre. Keep eyes closed for 3 minutes. Once dry, your model can now open and close their own eyes to reveal Frankenstein's yellow eyeballs. Your look is complete!
